

WORSHIP NOTES FROM FR. JENSON

Today is the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. As you enter the church, you'll notice that the look has changed considerably this week. The Christmas manger, trees, garland, and decorating lights are all gone till next year. We are in Ordinary Time for a short period until Ash Wednesday next month.

Green is the color for Ordinary Time, the color of growing things and the growth process itself. The truths of our faith that we celebrated during Advent and Christmas are renewed in us, and we seek to grow our faith due to those seasons in the church year.

Our Gospel is from St. John's Gospel, supplementing the much shorter Gospel of St. Mark we will normally be reading from this liturgical year. St. John the Baptist sees Jesus passing by and points him to two of his disciples, calling him the Lamb of God. This takes place before Jesus began to call His apostles. Andrew, Peter's brother, is one of the two disciples of John the Baptist who heard Jesus called the Lamb of God. Andrew and the other set out after Jesus and stayed with him that evening, no doubt in deep conversation about faith. Andrew went to his brother Peter, told him they had found the Messiah, and took him to Jesus. Andrew was the first person to bring someone to Jesus.

As we move into Ordinary Time, the season for growth in faith, we are to try and do as St. Andrew did and help bring someone to Jesus.

This calls for growing our faith so that the Holy Spirit can guide us more clearly. Then, we find ways to learn how to bring our faith to another, which is often challenging. Those involved with the Archdiocesan Synod implementation from our two parishes are preparing to help work on sharing faith in practical and sensitive ways. I'm curious and hopeful that we'll be able to take some steps forward to bring back our lost brothers and sisters. Be blessed and joyful this week. Our Lady, Ss. Peter, Paul, and Thomas, pray for us!



CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question:

Why do we make changes in the Mass? Some seem so small and unimportant. Are they really necessary?

Answer:

The celebration of the Eucharist is at the heart of our identity as Catholics. Our purpose as a Church community revolves around the Eucharist. Everything we are and everything we do is measured not only by how well we celebrate, but also by how well we live the sacrament. If that is so, then we as a community will always strive to celebrate the Mass as best we can. The reasons for some changes might seem more obvious than others, but there is a reason behind each one

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal is the introduction to the Missal that contains all the prayers for the celebration of the Mass. The Order of Mass we use now was issued in 1975 and, as often happens over the course of years, some questions have come up about the proper way of doing some things and whether or not other practices are acceptable. These changes clarify some things and make the celebration of the Mass more meaningful for everyone.

The opportunity is presented to us to better learn and understand each part of the Mass, which in turn should help us deepen our appreciation for its beauty and meaning. We will be a better Church if we have a clearer understanding and knowledge of Who and what we celebrate.

QUESTION + ANSWER

Q: Why do we use incense at Mass?



A: The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity and is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass and in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word, and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. We can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during Eucharistic Adoration and benediction and the deceased's body at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).
