

WORSHIP NOTES FROM FR. JENSON

Today's Mass is the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. On this feast, we honor the visit of the Magi to Mary, Joseph, and the infant Jesus at Bethlehem. The Magi, or astrologers as they are sometimes called, represent the pagan peoples of the world. In some ancient religions, observing signs in the heavens was a part of their religion.

Unusual heavenly events like comets or eclipses were thought to be portents, indicators of the gods signaling that they were about to do something important in our midst. Hence, the star that appeared in the sky as Jesus was born was noticed by the Magi, and they sought to see where it might lead them and to whom.

A star was prophesied to appear over Jacob in the Book of Numbers. Many Jews lived in the lands the Magi came from, roughly modern-day Iraq, following their exile in 586 BC. They could, therefore, have been aware of this star being prophesied in Jewish scriptures and that it would indicate a great one, a king to be born there. Hence, they brought with them rich gifts.

The Magi themselves, as non-Jews or pagans, were the first non-Jews to see Jesus and honor him with their gifts of gold, frankincense, and Myrrh. They traveled hundreds of miles out of curiosity to see this newborn king of the Jews.

The wise men's energy and drive to see this newborn king is a model for our desire to get up and follow our true Lord and King Jesus. May their example help us live our Christian faith with the energy and passion to encounter our Lord Jesus daily!




STUDY: HEALING THE WHOLE PERSON

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Question:

How are the feasts of the baptism of Jesus and the account of the wedding feast of Cana related to the Epiphany celebration?

Answer:

The Epiphany season focuses on revealing Jesus to the world. Following the Christmas celebration, the liturgical year lays out a series of manifestation points in which Jesus is made publicly known. From its very beginning, the Christian community highlighted three events in the life of Jesus. These are the Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord and the wedding feast at Cana.

The Epiphany discloses Jesus to the world of the Gentiles, represented by the magi from the East. The accounts of Jesus' baptism reveal his identity and mission, along with exposing him to those to whom he was sent to minister. The miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding feast of Cana, unique to John's Gospel, is the first public sign that Jesus performs, thus manifesting his public identity and his powers.

Today in the Roman Church, these are usually celebrated on three successive Sundays: Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord which is usually the next Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana, which is proclaimed on the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in lectionary year C.

These feasts connect around the concept of epiphany, public manifestation of Jesus to the world. They help us get to know more intimately who Jesus is and what he is about. Spend some time delving more deeply into your understanding of who Jesus is. Continue to cultivate these "epiphany" moments in your life.

QUESTION + ANSWER

Q: Why Does the Church Have Different Liturgical Cycles?



A: While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is unlike the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the Lectionary that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in Sacrosanctum Concilium, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way, a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people over a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when Pope Saint Paul VI approved the new cycles of readings.


