As you participate in the parish community, we'll help draw you ever close to Jesus Christ and in the loving care of His people. These are exciting times to be at St. Thomas the Apostle!



MASS

The central act of worship in the Catholic Church. In most Eastern Catholic churches, the Mass is called the Divine Liturgy. The Mass is divided into two main parts. The Liturgy of the Word includes Scripture readings and a homily and ends with general intercessions. The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with offering gifts, followed by consecration of the bread and wine and the reception of Communion. COMMUNITY COLLECTIONS

St. Thomas the Apostle also hosts several collections for those in need throughout the year. These will be listed in bulletins, social media, weekly enews, and the website.

Examples of these collections are second collections during worship services (Catholic Services Appeal, Catholic Home Missions Appeal, etc.), Archdiocese envelope collections (Peters Pence, Religious Retirement, etc.), donation drives (baby items, winter coats, food, etc.), and ongoing collections (St.Teresa Orphans Foundation).

ADDITIONAL WAYS TO GIVE

St. Thomas the Apostle relies on the support of our parishioners to keep our faith formation active and our church facilities safe and up to date. Gifts to St. Thomas the Apostle can be made in a variety of ways that are tax-efficient. Catholic Community Foundation (CCF) is our trusted partner that helps facilitate many of these transactions at no fee. As you consider your commitment, please review the following options:

Check or Electronic Giving

Donors can give by placing their donation in the basket during weekend Masses or by giving electrically. Donors can easily set up recurring giving by visiting our website. Tap on "Giving", then tap on "Sunday Donation or New Church Campaign." Such charitable contributions may be tax deductible.

Matching Gifts

Many employers sponsor matching gift programs and will match any charitable donations their employees make. This may allow you to double the impact of your gift! Check with your employer to determine if a gift to St. Thomas the Apostle is eligible for a matching gift.

Charitable Contributions of Stocks and Securities

Gifts of appreciated assets such as stocks, bonds, and mutual funds are an excellent way to support St. Thomas the Apostle and at the same time maximize tax savings. To claim these benefits, they must be transferred to our parish directly.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA


If you are over 70.5 years old, you may make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA up to \$100,000 per year. The distribution can offset a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). A QCD can be particularly beneficial for donors who do not itemize and instead use the standard deduction.

Donation of Assets

Donating real estate, business, personal property, and other complex gifts can provide valuable tax benefits. The donor receives a tax deduction equal to the property's fair market value and avoids capital gains on the appreciated property.

Bequest in a Will or Estate Plan

Designate St. Thomas the Apostle Church in your will or estate plan with a dollar amount or percentage of your estate as a gift.

PARISH EVENTS

St. Thomas the Apostle hosts several events throughout the year with the goal of building Catholic community. Below is a sample list of typical events (*this list is subject to change*). Events will be listed in bulletins, social media, weekly enews, and the website.

- **Parish Festival** in August is St. Thomas's largest event of the year. It includes a delicious turkey dinner, a cash raffle, an interactive kid's area, a beer tent, cash Bingo, a silent auction, a craft sale, a farmer's market + bake sale, a cake walk, music, and much more!
- **Feast Day Celebration** celebrates St. Thomas the Apostle who the Church is named after (includes delicious treats).
- Lenten opportunities include soup and/or fish fry suppers, Stations of the Cross, speakers, etc.
- **Ham and/or Turkey Bingo** is hosted each year by the St. Thomas Men's Club.
- Garage Sale in October is hosted by the St. Thomas Women's Club.
- **The Lock-In** is an overnight event for the middle and high school youth that includes games, dancing, video games, movies, and prayer.
- Blaster Battle is an event where youth use foam blasters during the games and activities.
- **Dinner and craft sales** are held to help raise funds for youth programs, missions, etc.
- **Cookie bake and exchange** happens during the holiday time. Portions of the cookies are donated to housebound parishioners, etc.
- Various pancake breakfasts and cafe brunches are always fun for the family in the Parish Center dining hall following Mass.
- Blue Mass + Brunch celebrates local police, fire, and first responders.
- Volunteer appreciation events are a way to say thank you to those who help at St. Thomas.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION subject to change


For Adults

- Bible study group meets weekly during the academic year.
- **Small Groups** include moments of relational connection, spiritual growth through teaching and discussion, and prayer with and for one another (topic varies).
- **The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)** is the name of the process taken by adults to enter into the Catholic Church.
- Well Read Mom's Book Club women accompanying one another in reading the classics, and timeless spiritual works from Western and Christian traditions to nurture moral imagination. It aims to help women make space for reading and reflection.

For Children and Youth

- Faith Formation
 - Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (age 4-grade 1)
 - *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* and supplemented by *Word of Life* by Augustine Institute includes Reconciliation and Holy Communion (grade 2)
 - Word of Life (grades 3-5)
 - Confirmation (grades 6-8)
- Holy Apostles Youth Group is a fun, Christ-centered community for youth (grades 6-12)
- Holy Apostles COR Team are students (grade 9-12) who serve our community as leaders.
- Vacation Bible School (VBS) summer programming for children (age 4-Kindergarten)
- Totus Tuus is a week-long Catholic summer day camp for children and youth (grades 1-12)
- **Extreme Faith Camp** is a week-long summer faith camp for youth (age 6-12) at Trinity Woods (*trinitywoodscatholic.com*).
- **Steubenville** is a Catholic summer conference to bring youth (grades 9-12) into a life-changing encounter with Jesus Christ.


