




WORSHIP JESUS IN THE MASS

MASS

The central act of worship in the Catholic Church. In most Eastern Catholic churches, the Mass is called the Divine Liturgy. The Mass is divided into two main parts. The Liturgy of the Word includes Scripture readings and a homily and ends with general intercessions. The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with offering gifts, followed by consecration of the bread and wine and the reception of Communion. 

Check or Electronic Giving

Donors can give by placing their donation in the basket during weekend Masses or by giving electrically. Donors can easily set up recurring giving by visiting our website. Tap on "Giving", then tap on "Sunday Donation or New Church Campaign." Such charitable contributions may be tax deductible.

Matching Gifts

Many employers sponsor matching gift programs and will match any charitable donations their employees make. This may allow you to double the impact of your gift! Check with your employer to determine if a gift to St. Thomas the Apostle is eligible for a matching gift.

Charitable Contributions of Stocks and Securities

Gifts of appreciated assets such as stocks, bonds, and mutual funds are an excellent way to support St. Thomas the Apostle and at the same time maximize tax savings. To claim these benefits, they must be transferred to our parish directly.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA


If you are over 70.5 years old, you may make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA up to \$100,000 per year. The distribution can offset a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). A QCD can be particularly beneficial for donors who do not itemize and instead use the standard deduction.

Donation of Assets

Donating real estate, business, personal property, and other complex gifts can provide valuable tax benefits. The donor receives a tax deduction equal to the property's fair market value and avoids capital gains on the appreciated property.

Bequest in a Will or Estate Plan

Designate St. Thomas the Apostle Church in your will or estate plan with a dollar amount or percentage of your estate as a gift.



PARISH EVENTS

St. Thomas the Apostle hosts several events throughout the year with the goal of building Catholic community. Below is a sample list of typical events (this list is subject to change). Events will be listed in bulletins, social media, weekly enews, and the website.

- **Festival** in August is St. Thomas's largest fundraiser event of the year. It includes a delicious turkey dinner, a cash drawing, an interactive kid's area, a beer tent, cash Bingo, a silent auction, a craft sale, a farmer's market + bake sale, a cake walk, music, and much more!
- Feast Day Celebration celebrates St. Thomas the Apostle who the Church is named after (includes delicious treats).
- Lenten opportunities include soup and/or fish fry suppers, Stations of the Cross, speakers, etc.
- Ham and/or Turkey Bingo is hosted each year by the St. Thomas Men's Club.
- Garage Sale in October is hosted by the St. Thomas Women's Club.
- **The Lock-In** is an overnight event for the middle and high school youth that includes games, dancing, video games, movies, and prayer.
- Blaster Battle is an event where youth use foam blasters during the games and activities.
- Dinner and craft sales are held to help raise funds for youth programs, missions, etc.
- **Cookie bake and exchange** happens during the holiday time. Portions of the cookies are donated to homebound parishioners, etc.
- Various pancake breakfasts and cafe brunches are always fun for the family in the Parish Center dining hall following Mass.
- Volunteer appreciation events are a way to say thank you to those who help at St. Thomas.



Lector at Mass

Lectors proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture to the gathered assembly. Their ministry calls them to allow the Word of God to speak through them so that it comes alive in the hearts of those who hear it and to lead the assembly in praying the Prayers of the Faithful.



Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion at Mass or to the Homebound

Ministers of Holy Communion are entrusted with the special responsibility of assisting the priest and deacon in distributing the Body and Blood of Christ. The function of this ministry is to ensure that the Eucharist is distributed under both forms of bread and wine reverently. To become a Eucharist Minister, one must participate in the appropriate training and periodic enrichment sessions.



Usher at Mass

Create a welcoming environment by greeting worshippers and helping with seating when needed. Pass the collection baskets during Offertory, distribute bulletins, and tidy up the worship space after Mass.



Hospitality after Mass

Set up donuts, coffee, and other beverages in the Parish Center following Sunday Masses to welcome folks and create a space of Catholic community.



Music at Mass

Participants share their musical gifts and talents with the parish as cantors, choir members, instrumentalists, and accompanists. To get involved, email Music Director Carrie Ferdinandt at *carrieannf1@gmail.com*.



Sacristan

Sacristans prepare and care for the various liturgical items used during the sacraments—holy water, holy oils, incense, candles, and the gifts of bread and wine. They prepare the feast and celebration by preparing and purifying Eucharistic vessels and other liturgical tasks.



Altar Server

Altar Servers are the helping hands for the presider at liturgies. This ministry is open to students who have received their First Holy Communion.


OCIA

The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) is an instruction in the Catholic faith for adults who have received some Christian sacraments, are in a different Christian denomination, are not a Christian, or are seeking to enter the Catholic Church and want to deepen their knowledge and appreciation of their faith. Candidates are initiated, baptized, or confirmed at the Easter Vigil annually.

Faith Formation

Classes run from September through May at St. Thomas from 6:15-7:30pm. Please note: Due to limited space, enrollment in this program is only available to St. Thomas and Ss. Peter & Paul registered members.

- Age 4 Grade 1: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is used. Trained Catechists teach children about the Mass and the Gospels using the Montessori method.
- Grade 2: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is used and includes Reconciliation and Holy Communion.
- Grades 3 6: Word of Life by the Augustine Institute is a comprehensive curriculum that calls children, parents, teachers, and catechists to conversion and transformation in Christ.
- Grades 7 8: YDisciple is used. Youth in grades nine and above who have not yet received this sacrament are welcome!



Youth Group

Provides a fun and positive environment for youth in grades 6-12 to grow in knowledge and love of their Catholic Faith as disciples of Jesus Christ through worship, fellowship, and service projects.



Summer Programs

Extreme Faith Camp is a week-long summer faith camp at Trinity Woods (in Trego, WI) for middle and high school students. It's a high-adventure, extremely fun camp packed with outdoor activities, including archery tag, laser tag, a climbing wall, 9-square, GaGa Ball, volleyball, swimming, canoeing, and fishing. The camp is based on the sacraments, offering daily Mass, perpetual Adoration, and Confession. Many students who attend say it is a life-changing experience.



Tracking Mary is a Vacation Bible School (VBS) program for children aged PreK-Kindergarten.

Totus Tuus is a week-long Catholic summer day camp for children in grades 1-12. Totus Tuus promotes the Catholic faith through catechesis, evangelization, Christian witness, and Eucharistic worship. The goal is to help young people deepen their understanding of and strengthen their faith by establishing a real and personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

Family Intercessory Hour

First Saturday Devotion

There are Confessions from 7:30am-8:15am. The Rosary starts at 7:50am before Mass at 8:30am. All are invited to join in this beautiful devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Mass will be in the Novus Ordo (new order) English form with some Latin inserted at parts.



Rosary Ministry

The Blessed Virgin Rosary Ministry (BVRM) consists of people dedicated to praying a "decade a day." Each member is assigned a specific decade to pray each day. Members offer up the decade for the Rosary Ministry members, their families, and for the special monthly intention. The time commitment is short and is a wonderful way of joining others in prayer.
